The PSH LAN account is solely used to login to office computers on the PSH campus. Although the username for your PSH LAN account is the same as the username for your Penn State Access Account, it is not the same account and does not share the same password. Your Penn State Access Account is used for University-wide services such as email and Angel, and is also used for logging in to **public** computers on our campus.
