

Job Fair advice from students

- Come prepared
- Prepare a 30 second commercial about yourself
- Research potential employers (company history), ask questions, and don't sell yourself short
- Make sure you research the companies so you have a better idea of who you want to talk to and how you fit into their organization
- If employers have websites-check them out and do the application online
- Listen thoughtfully and ask intelligent questions
- Make eye contact, firm handshake, speak clearly
- Sell yourself!
- Bring plenty of resumes and know what you want to say-don't be only interested in freebies
- Be confident ; Don't be intimidated
- Be prepared before you come, it will boost your confidence and really help
- Prepare your approach to employees
- Just make sure you are prepared and know what jobs you are looking for
- Be yourself and don't be afraid to approach people
- Don't go to your top choice employer first. Give hints that make you stand out
- Know your goals (career wise)
- Be friendly and open to talking to everyone
- Know the employer and type of job you are looking for
- Loosen up, have fun, but be professional
- Visit the fair website ahead of time and check the company links
- Practice questions/Come with Questions
- Be prepared for anything
- Be friendly, introduce yourself, explain why you are here
- Don't be shy, you have nothing to lose
- Have plenty of resumes on hand
- Have an idea of what you are looking for
- Know who you want to talk to before you get there. Research and prepare
- Relax and be yourself
- Learn about the companies' interests/goals before going to the job fair
- Talk to as many employers as possible
- Research the companies – know what they are about and be able to carry conversation
- Have an open mind, look at companies that might not have caught your interest at first
- Be prepared with extra resumes
- Make extra time to research companies
- Don't be nervous! Be positive/confident
- Be prepared to talk to everyone and anyone
- Know the companies and what they are looking for
- Do research, be professional, sum up qualifications for potential employers
- The positions employers are looking for
- Make sure you have an opening ready, (30 second commercial about self, to help you feel more confident
- Be ready: physically, mentally, professionally
- Definitely "over prepare"
- Know what you are looking for
- Know what is available from a company before hand – show you know what they have to offer
- Research what positions companies have open. They might deal primarily with your major, or they might be looking for specific jobs for specific majors
