

Julie R. Ancis is a Distinguished Professor and former Interim Chair in the Department of Informatics and Founding Director of the Cyberpsychology Program at the New Jersey Institute of Technology. She is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association (Divisions 17, 35, and 46) and has been active in leadership roles in the APA and other organizations, such as serving as Chair of APA's Society of Counseling Psychology's Section for the Advancement of Women. She has received a number of awards and honors, including Woman of the Year from the Section on the Advancement of Women.

Dr. Ancis' extensive scholarly publications include 4 books, over 80 journal articles, book chapters, and technical reports; and over 200 professional presentations focused on diversity, multicultural competence, the legal system, and human-computer interaction. She currently has two books in progress with Wiley, one focused on antisemitism and psychology.

Dr. Ancis is the founder and president of Psychologists Against Antisemitism, established in May 2021. Her current research is on online antisemitism.
