The College

Penn State Harrisburg is the largest and most comprehensive of Penn State's Commonwealth Campuses. An undergraduate college and graduate school, Penn State Harrisburg offers more than 75 academic programs and is the only campus, along with University Park, to offer degrees from the associate to doctoral levels.

Originally serving only upper division and graduate students, Penn State Harrisburg transitioned to a four-year college in 2004. The college provides student access to higher education from three distinct entry points – freshman, transfer, and graduate – and its history has permitted the college to develop particular expertise in serving transfer students.

Penn State Harrisburg has successfully sought accreditation for all programs with an eligible national accrediting body:

- Undergraduate engineering and engineering technology programs are accredited by ABET.
- School of Business programs are AACSB-accredited (Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business).
- The college is a member in good standing with the Association for Advancing Quality in Educator Preparation (AAQEP).
- The undergraduate Criminal Justice program is accredited by the ACJS (Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences).
- NASPAA (National Association of Schools of Public Affairs and Administration) accredits the Public Administration master's program.
- The master's in Applied Behavioral Analysis is certified by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB).

An early provider of online education, Penn State Harrisburg currently offers several undergraduate and graduate programs via Penn State's World Campus, and several in partnership with other Penn State colleges. The college offers numerous online and hybrid courses.

The college's academic units are divided into five schools: Behavioral Sciences and Education; Business Administration; Humanities; Public Affairs; and Science, Engineering, and Technology.

Student Housing

On-campus housing for more than 690 students includes single-, double-, or triple-occupancy apartment-style housing, and double-occupancy suite-style housing for first-year students.

Library

The three-story, 115,000-square-foot, technologically advanced academic research library includes more than 300,000 volumes and 400 journals. With access to more than 750 databases and over 110,000 online full-text journals through the University Libraries, the facility provides extensive support to resident and online users.

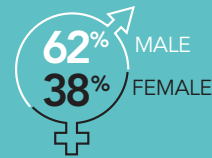
Athletics

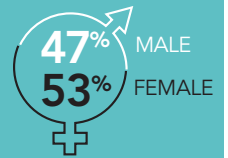


Minority Enrollment
